Readings as Mass: We have decided to expand the Sunday / Feast Day Liturgies of the Word again to give us the option of including both readings. These will still be provided on separate sheets for each Sunday Mass.

Month of the Holy Souls: All the Masses during November will be offered for those priests and parishioners, family members and friends whom we remember on our lists. Envelopes can be placed in the Collection boxes or baskets at the back of the churches.

Stella Maris: Apostleship of the Sea: We will have a short appeal at the end of Mass from Mike Barile (St Leonard & St Fergus' and St Columba's) and Claire Colvin (St Mary's) and there will be baskets at the back of the churches for a second collection to help the work of those who help support seafarers in ports around the country.

Talks and 'Lectio Divina': The first talk in our series will be available on Facebook this Tuesday, 17th November at 7pm. Fr Michael McMahon from the Diocese of Paisley will give us an introduction to the Gospel of St Mark. We will be following the Gospel of St Mark for the Ordinary Sundays 2021. The talk will remain on Facebook for you to re-play or catch up with at your leisure. There will also be a short explanation of 'Lectio Divina' and the form that these reflections will take.

Advance Planning: With the current restrictions we will have to plan carefully for our Christmas Masses. Over the coming weeks we will be asking those who are attending Mass which Mass they would like to attend in our churches at Christmas. At the moment things are still in a state of flux as regards numbers but some planning need to take place now. To start with there will probably be two vigil Masses in St Mary's and two between St Columba's and St Leonard and St Fergus and two morning Masses according to the same pattern that we have at the moment. We will probably stream a late evening Mass on Christmas Eve and this will be as on a Sunday (full Mass with singing). As we see what numbers we have wishing to attend, and if these exceed capacity, we will look to see what other Masses we might be able to offer. I know that many people come to our churches at Christmas when they might be intermittent in their Mass attendance through the year. We will also ask how many might be in your group for Christmas Mass and try our best to accommodate those who wish to come. Unfortunately, if things remain as they are, it will mean that our Christmas Masses will lack the singing of carols etc. However, we will endeavour, as we do every Sunday, to make the Mass the prayerful, spiritual experience that it should be for all of us.
