**Funerals:** I wish to express my sincerest thanks to and appreciation of those parishioners who manage to come to our funeral Masses: it is a great support to me and to the families, especially when the family members may not be regular attenders at Mass. However, it is also a witness to the fact that at every funeral Mass we are praying for one of our own who has gone home to God, whether we know them or not. Again, my sincere thanks.

**Masks and Singing:** I have been guilty of giving a poor example by singing without a mask. Singing does increase the distance that the droplets on our breath travel and so is an easier way for the virus to be transmitted. As awkward and unpleasant as it is, I would have to ask that you do not lower your mask when singing.

**For those who wish to maintain social distancing:** In St Mary's please use the side aisle pews on the left as you look at the altar and in St Leonard & St Fergus, the two areas at the front and to either side of the altar. Due to the size of St Columba's there would not seem to be the same need to designate a particular area.

**Receiving Holy Communion:** Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue are asked to wait until the end of the Communion procession and come to the priest rather than to the Eucharistic Minister. There will still be some priests who do not feel ready to distribute Holy Communion in this way and we respect their continuing reservations.

**Children's Liturgy:** St Columba's will restart their children's liturgy today during the 11.45am Mass. This will be for children up to and including P3.

**National Pilgrimage to Carfin:** About 30 people from our own and neighbouring parishes made the trip through to Carfin last Sunday and were blessed with fine weather, adding to the joyful nature of the day. Apparently the only complaint was that it was all too short! Next year is the centenary of the Shrine and we will look at organizing a pilgrimage for ourselves so that many of us can journey together for Mass and a time of prayerful devotion at this 'Scottish Lourdes'.

Chrism Mass—Tuesday 14th September: The Cathedral will operate a booking system for reserving a space at the Chrism Mass which will take place this Tuesday, 14th September 2021 at 7pm. It is important that those who wish to attend book a place for the Mass in advance as demand is expected to be high. A number of seats will be 'socially distanced', whilst the remainder are not. The seat categories are as follows: 1. Downstairs 'Socially Distanced' Seating; 2. Downstairs Non Socially Distanced Seating; 3. Upstairs 'Socially Distanced' Seating; 4. Upstairs Non Socially Distanced Seating. Please note that there that there is no disabled access or lift to the upstairs seating, and that tickets booked upstairs are not transferable downstairs on the day of the Mass.

Tickets can be booked online on the **Eventbrite** website—https://www.eventbrite.co.uk/e/chrism-mass-at-st-andrews-cathedral-dundee-tickets-168107535163. Alternatively, you can search for 'Chrism Mass at St Andrew's RC Cathedral, Dundee'. **If you have no internet access,** a limited number of tickets have been set aside for booking over the phone. This can be done by calling or texting 07561 699557 and leaving a message with your name, contact phone number, the type of seat(s) you require and for how many e.g. one upstairs socially distanced seat. If you don't hear back from the Cathedral Mass Booking Team, your booking is confirmed. Unless exempt on medical grounds, face coverings must be worn on entering the Cathedral and for the duration of Holy Mass. You will be shown to an allocated seat by a Steward on your arrival which you must sit in.
