The Sacred Triduum

The Liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Great Vigil of Easter mark the highpoint of our year as Catholics and help us to reflect upon the central mysteries of our faith: the gift of the Most Holy Eucharist; the Passion and Death of the Lord and the Glory fo the Resurrection—the mysteries that have brought about our Salvation. We are encouraged to attend these liturgies so that we might be reminded of the debt of gratitude we owe to the Lord for the great love for each of us that meant he accepted the Father's will to suffer and die to save us from sin, and rise to bring us to eternal life; with the Holy Eucharist left as an assurance of his presence with us and as food for the journey. With grateful hearts we accompany the Lord in this our Holy Week.

Proposals for works to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of St Leonard & St Fergus: Thank you for the varied feedback offered. There was a suggestion that because of the professional nature of the drawings that decisions had already been taken. I can assure you that this is not so. These are sketches from a firm so that the proposals are clear and able to be visualized. This is also only one area for proposed improvement. We will look at the heating system as well as the arrangements on the Sanctuary. It is almost 40 years since anything major has been done in the church and it would be good to have a look at what we might achieve for the Jubilee. All of these works will start as proposals upon which the congregation can offer their views. The Diocesan Curia will also have to be approached for their input. I will ask for volunteers to join with me (in the spirit of our recent synodality process) to look at and discuss all proposals.
