## **Return to Normal**

Easter seems like a good moment to reintroduce parts of our usual church life that have been missing due to the various COVID restrictions.

**Welcoming Groups:** One of the characteristics of any Christian community is the welcome that people receive when they arrive in church. This is especially important for people who are coming to a particular church for the first time or returning to Church following a period of absence. Those who fulfilled this role in the past know how important it is and I am sure will again resume this service to the community, but it would also be good to see new volunteers coming forward. We will leave lists at the back of the church for you to sign up!

**Offertory Processions:** Again, an important part of the Liturgy at Sunday Mass is the Offertory Procession when we bring forward the gifts to be offered on the altar. The offering is also symbolic of the offering we make to God of our whole lives which will also be blessed and renewed through the saving action of Christ at each Mass. Part of the role of the welcoming group will be to ask people to bring the gifts forward. If you are approached, please do not shy away from taking part—you are among friends!

**St Vincent de Paul Society:** The members of the SVdP will once again stand with the boxes as we leave the church. The calls on the SVdP for help and support in these financially challenging times are growing and your donations to the SVdP are helping local need.

**Collections:** I would like some feedback on whether people want to see a return to the traditional basket collections or to leave things as they stand—there have been views expressed in favour of both. Please speak to any of us to make your views known...but perhaps leave it until next weekend!

**Pastoral Councils:** Since the restrictions were lifted, we have never regained the pattern of regular Pastoral Council meetings. We will call meetings in the three communities during the Easter Season to renew and reviatlise this important aspect of parish life.

**St Leonard & St Fergus—Children's Liturgy:** From next Sunday there will be children's Liturgy during the 10am Mass. This will for children who are aged 4+ to end of P4. The children will be invited to leave Mass after the greeting and will return at the Offertory.

**Celebration in Honour of Divine Mercy:** Next Sunday we will hold a service in **St Columba's** to mark the 2nd Sunday of Easter—Divine Mercy Sunday. There will be a service including Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction at 4pm.

**Planning for Eastertide:** There has been a request for some spiritual input / reflections to do together rather than simply online. We will have a chat with some of you informally to see what we might be able to provide and advertise some ideas next week.

**Masks in Church:** There is now no requirement to wear masks in church, but please be sensitive to those who wish to continue to wear them. Priests and Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist will continue to wear masks when distributing Holy Communion.

**Collections:** St Mary's £1104; St Columba's £234; St Leonard & St Fergus' £493. Thank you for your continuing generosity to the work of the Church and to those in need.

**SCIAF—Ukraine:** Although we have now ceased the official collection, another £305 was donated through St Mary's last week and £45 from St Columba's.
