Liturgy Matters—Silence

"Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at designated times. Its nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act and again after the invitation to pray, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him.

Even before the celebration itself, it is praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal)

Property Matters discussed at the Diocesan Fabric and Planning meeting:

- **St Columba's:** Agreed that new lighting work go ahead, as well as replacing warped wood of center aisle (warning signs have been put in place indicating this). Electrical Inspection has been carried out now waiting on it's recommendations before deciding how to progress with the other recommendations made in the recent Condition Survey.
- **St Mary's:** Permission granted to further acquisition of Carrara marble used during Pope Benedict's Mass at Bellahouston Park for provision of new altar etc. Noted that Fr Mark Cassidy has external funding in place for removal of old altar, and construction of new, at no expense to the parish. Also discussed the possibility of hiring a consultant to project manage St Mary's Renovation.
- St Leonard's & St Fergus: Reordering of the Sanctuary and Welcoming Area: it was thought prudent to wait for Ormsby's to get back with more detailed plans and costing whilst exploring the possibility of acquiring altar furniture from recently closed parishes in our own diocese.
