Last week marked the **60th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council**, the late Fr John W. O'Malley S.J. (dean of church historians) sums up it's legacy thus, the church moved from "commands to invitations, from laws to ideals, from definition to mystery, from threats to persuasion, from coercion to conscience, from monologue to dialogue, from ruling to serving, from withdrawn to integrated, from vertical to horizontal, from exclusion to inclusion, from hostility to friendship, from rivalry to partnership, from suspicion to trust, from static to ongoing, from passive acceptances to active engagement, from fault-finding to appreciation, from prescriptive to principles, from behavior modification to inner appropriation." **Care Not Killing** (CNK), supported by the Catholic Parliamentary Office, has launched a petition which aims to stop plans to legalise assisted suicide. Liam McArthur MSP, has indicated that he expects to introduce his assisted suicide bill at Holyrood in early 2023.

The bill risks undermining the provision of palliative care and undermining efforts to prevent suicide. It will make the most vulnerable people, including the elderly and disabled, feel like a burden and its safeguards will prove futile. The current law is the safeguard– it prohibits assisting someone's suicide and/or killing them by euthanasia. The state has a responsibility to provide care, not deliberate killing, for those at the end of life.

## **Property Matters:**

- **St Columba's:** Electrical Inspection Report received and quote for recommended work being sought; light fittings installment starting 17th October; central aisle's warped wood replaced, carpet squares to be relayed this week. Please be careful in the meanwhile.
- **St Mary's:** full team meeting (17 October) with Architect to present Heritage Report and discuss funding package. Quote of £2,370 accepted to make safe remaining Perspex panels protecting widows and remedial work to flat roofs.
- **St Leonard's & St Fergus:** Hamptons have inspected hall floor and remedies are being explored. John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) met with Fr Alex, Fr Jim and Avril Kidd (Chair PC) to discuss insurance implications of car park usage; and general discussion about how to maintain our parish properties. We were in agreement that given the mandatory inspections required each parish requires a Maintenance Person/Committee.
- **St Columba's, St Leonard & St Fergus, and St Mary's:** Gas boilers to be serviced by East Coast Combustions by the end of the month.

As can be seen from the above keeping our buildings safe is an ongoing matter which with a little organization and help can be a relatively straightforward process. If you have experience of buildings or administration and would be willing to help coordinate the now mandatory inspections please contact Fr Jim or Fr Alex. Several parishes (throughout the diocese) are working in conjunction with John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) and now have people fulfilling this role to the great benefit of their parish.
