Property Matters:

Last week I met with Malcolm Veal (Chancellor of the Diocese) and John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) to discuss the building projects currently under consideration in our 3 parishes. Several things are worth noting: the Diocese has decided to employ an Architect to oversee all its' listed buildings, therefore, St Mary's Renovation Project will fall under their remit. Secondly, any building/maintenance project in excess of £5,000 needs the permission of the Diocesan Fabric and Planning Committee, therefore the work needing done both in St C's and St L&F's will need to be placed before the Committee on 29th November.

St Columba's: This week several Heating Consultants carried out surveys and will produce reports highlighting possible methods of heating the church, they'll be produced as a matter of urgency; as will the Damp Specialist who carried out a survey on Friday. John O'Meara has also organized another couple of quotes from roofers one of which is a flat roof specialist recommended by an architect. All these reports and quotes will be looked at by the Diocesan Fabric & Planning Committee on 29 November.

St Mary's: The new Architect (appointed by the Diocese) visited with John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) and Sanam Ogden (Historic Churches Consultant employed by the Diocese), and met with myself and Ged Fitzpatrick who has agreed to be a member of the Liaison Group which will help keep the parish informed of progress. They're going to visit again in the near future to survey the hall and house.

St Leonard's & St Fergus: Mr Ormbsy (the Church Furnisher that Fr Mark had consulted re the re-ordering of the Sanctuary and Welcome area) described and discussed with the PC, John O'Meara, Fr Alex and myself the proposed work.
