Catholicism—A series of programmes by Bishop Robert Barron exploring the beauty and truth of the Catholic Faith. Deacon Len has decided to run two courses: one for those interested in joining the Church, and another for parishioners simply wishing to deepen their own faith. These will run on alternate Tuesday's after 10am Mass in St Mary's. This coming Tuesday 15 November will be the course for those wishing to join the church.

Property Matters: Over the last 3 weeks our 3 parishes' gas boilers have underwent their annual inspection and service. This has resulted in St C's boiler being condemned and various replacement options being considered.

This week I met again with Malcolm Veal (Chancellor of the Diocese) and John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) to discuss the building projects currently under consideration in our 3 parishes. Several things are worth noting: the Diocese has decided to employ an architect to oversee all its' listed buildings, therefore, St Mary's Renovation Project will be placed with them. Secondly, any building/maintenance project in excess of £5,000 needs the permission of the Diocesan Fabric and Planning Committee, therefore the work needing done both in St C's and St L&F's will need to be placed before the Committee on 29th November.

St Columba's: It was decided at the PC meeting that until a wet and dry rot inspection was carried out on the church, the roof and sill repairs would be put on hold, in order to determine the likely over-all cost of repairs. To action this Hamptons will survey the suspected areas for rot as soon as, whilst quotes are being obtained for roof and heating repairs. Heating Consultant to survey both St L&F and St C's this coming Wednesday to recommend appropriate heating method. All Masses will be held in the hall given how cold it is in the Church even when quite mild outside.

St Mary's: The 5 Gas Boilers were inspected and serviced in St Mary's Church/House/Hall complex. After a meeting with Malcolm Veal (Chancellor of Dunkeld Diocese) and John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) it was agreed that responsibility for the Renovation of St Mary's would be handed over to a Diocesan Team headed by John O'Meara and Sanam Ogden (a consultant Project Manager working for the Diocese). A small Liaison Group will be formed of St Mary's parishioners to liaise with the Diocese and keep us informed of progress. Of course our fund raising work is more important than ever given the increase in costs.

St Leonard's & St Fergus: Mr Ormbsy (the Church Furnisher that Fr Mark had consulted re the re-ordering of the Sanctuary and Welcome area) described and discussed with the PC, John O'Meara, Fr Alex and myself the proposed work.

John O'Meara agreed at the PC meeting to provide a training session for our Fabric Committees. Once we've established a Committee in each parish we will approach John for a date. Please consider joining/forming one of the Fabric Committees as they are essential for the safe running of our parishes.
