Secondly, Jesus' first coming in the stable at Bethlehem, the readings from 17th December to Christmas Day remind us of this, and thirdly, Jesus coming into the hearts of believers encouraged and supported by stories of His first and prophecies of His Second Coming. Maranatha (an ancient Aramaic word/prayer) meaning 'Come, Lord!'
