

The heart of religion

This list of some of Jesus' sayings give an indication of what is important to him. He states the religious tradition of the people when he says that he has not come to abolish the old religion, and that religion must go much deeper and be an affair of the heart. He asks for forgiveness and reconciliation when he speaks about leaving a gift at the altar to go for reconciliation. He commends marriage, and faithfulness in marriage, in his views on divorce. He believes in the respect for sexuality that is shown in not using a person. This collection of Jesus' sayings form a background to how he lived his life himself. He lived out these sayings in many of the events of his life, which we hear about on other Sundays. The Sermon on the Mount, of which this is part, is the backdrop to much of Jesus' life and mission, a sort of vision statement for his life and ministry.

Much of this went against the religious practice of his people, which was centred mostly on externals. He saw the ritual and the law of religion as important only if it came from the heart. This is the challenge always to religion - to live heartily what it enthusiastically believes. Practices in ritual and in religious custom and laws may change with different cultures and times; what is important is the way we live our lives, following Jesus and knowing that all our efforts to live like him are praised and rewarded. Pope Francis says, 'It is not enough to just respect the commandments and do nothing more. Christian life is not just an ethical life: it is an encounter with Jesus Christ' (9 May 2016).

Repeat a favourite gospel phrase as you breathe in; your outbreath is your thanks for this help in your life. Lord, your will be done each day in my life.

People in Syria and Türkiye urgently need your help.

In the early morning of 6 February, multiple earthquakes, the largest being of a devastating 7.8 magnitude, struck large areas of northern Syria and southern Türkiye with devastating effects.

With the situation worsening by the day, the need for your help only grows. Tens of thousands of families' lives have been torn apart with at least 24,000 people dead and over 60,000 injured. With freezing temperatures, and thousands left homeless, these numbers will only continue to rise.

The impact across the region has been devastating. But no place more so than in north-west Syria, where over 4 million people were already living in need of aid as the result of the ongoing civil conflict and current cholera outbreak.

As soon as the earthquake hit, SCIAF was able to act, sending £30,000 of initial support to provide emergency food, shelter and medical supplies across north-west Syria, through our local partners in the area.

As the days pass, the death toll will sadly continue to rise as significant numbers remain trapped in the debris of collapsed buildings, and many more struggle to access much needed aid in freezing temperatures.

We must do all that we can to prevent further deaths and help survivors to recover. Please give what you can today.

St Mary's 10am (School attending), and 6pm.

Ash Wednesday is the start of Lent, a 40 day period of repentance when Catholics take time to remind themselves that life indeed is limited: that we will die.

The Ash Wednesday ritual is simple. Catholics place ashes on their foreheads as a visible reminder to others that they acknowledge that their bodies will turn to ash one day, that life is indeed precarious, but that they are also a resurrection people.

Catholics believe that more lies beyond this end, and so the ashes are marked by the sign of faith — the cross — at once a symbol of God's destruction and His greatest triumph.

We listen to the words that the priest or minister says to us as he places the ashes on our forehead: "Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return." Or, "Turn away from sin, and be faithful to the Gospel.

Some questions to reflect on during the 40 days of Lent are: What is it that holds us back from really living our best life? What do we have to die to — or, at the very least, fast from — in order to liberate ourselves from our bad habits? What do we have to give of ourselves to others, to causes, to God, so that we may stretch ourselves into new ways of being? How does prayer center us into growth?

This is the stuff of Lent and Ash Wednesday kicks off the Lenten season for Catholics and other Christians.
