It has been suggested that we meet one further time after Easter to round off our deliberations and discern a way forward. Final Round Up Sessions for St Mary's this coming Thursday (27th) at 6.30pm, and next Sunday 30th at 12 noon. In the meanwhile I'll endeavour to highlight some of the key themes:

Theme 4— Leadership is of huge importance to Divine Renovation, firstly, that the Leader (in our case the Parish Priest) has a clear idea/vision of where he wants the parish(es) to be. He then casts that vision, and encourages others to adopt the vision. Of course, this vision has to be based upon the Great Commission to go and 'make disciples.'

My vision for our parishes is that they are: places of vibrant worship, welcoming of all comers, filled with people enthusiastic about their faith in Jesus Christ, and who are courageous enough to invite others into a personal relationship with Jesus through the parish.

The model of Divine Renovation hinges upon a Leadership Team, who are all in agreement (and are enthusiastic) about the basic vision for the parish, and are willing to help the Parish Priest make decisions regarding the direction and leadership of the parish. A prime function of the Leadership Team is to identify and raise up further leaders to help facilitate the ministries that are necessary for the running of the parish and in particular for the making of missionary disciples.

Sign Up Sunday is here at last...please place your completed form into the box provided...the information will them be collated and stored in a database...thanks to the small team in SSLF who are working with the Diocesan Team to make sure this is done in compliance with GDPH legislation. In the meanwhiles St Columba's and Ss Leonard and Fergus are organizing for representatives of the various ministries to be available after Sunday Masses to answer any questions regarding their ministry. This will take place over the next couple of weeks to allow the database to be established and for people to attend Fr Keith Herrera's talk on the Holy Spirit (and Alpha) in preparation for Pentecost.

My hope is that Fr Keith's talk will enhance the influence of the Holy Spirit in our parishes, and enliven our personal relationship with Jesus, so that we generously engage in the life of our parish, and are encouraged to take the Good News of Jesus to those outside the Church.

The first big moment of vocation is baptism. The anointing of chrism at baptism might be called the anointing for vocation.

The baptismal vocation is for witness, love and service. This is expressed in ways in which people live out their baptism in married life, single life - and within the single life, maybe religious life or priesthood.

Our active witness is to the life and the values of Jesus in our lives. Teaching is not itself a vocation, for example, but the way we teach is a way of living out our vocation. Lord, be with me as I offer myself in partnership with you to work in your world.
