Property Matters

St Columba's: Thanks to those who have arranged the removal and redesign of the back pews in St Columba's. This initiative (enabled with the help of Men's Shed volunteers) should create a flexible space at the back of the church for welcoming, prayer groups, a parish library, alpha courses, etc. All this is aimed at creating an Evangelizing parish reaching out with the Good News as Jesus commanded us to do, but first of all we have to be evangelized ourselves, set aflame with the Holy Spirit, contagious to the world. This new space is first and foremost to accommodate this.

St Mary's: The Restoration Steering Group met recently to create an action plan to fulfil the requirements of the various grant providers. We are due to meet again this coming Friday with Saman Ogden (Historical Consultant employed by the Diocese to apply for grants) and John O'Meara (Diocesan Property Manager) to hone the plan. We have been advised that we need to expand our team to include people with expertise in local history, fundraising, and the environment. The Centre holds

The gospel presents Jesus as the guide in life, the 'way, truth and life'. The Christian centre is the person of Christ. Our work for Jesus and our love for people, no matter what our calling in life, flow from this. Mother Teresa was once asked why she did what she did, and she simply said 'for Jesus'. This centre always holds, it cannot be unhinged. It is a deeply personal relationship: we are led by Jesus 'one by one', known by name, not as one of a group. We follow him as one we know, not a stranger.

We study his life and times, getting to know the places and events of his life, we become familiar with the gospels and get to know him in the heart. Prayer is the way of keeping our centre of conviction and motivation strong. Freedom grows and we begin to find him everywhere.

Different types of people and spirituality stress different aspects of Jesus. The Eastern approach to Jesus is very much the 'way'; while the African is the 'life'. The European stress is the 'truth'. In Europe we need to rediscover also the joy and vibrancy of the African and Latin American expressions of faith, and also the presence of God in all life's moods and journeys of the Indian and Eastern traditions. We can get so caught up in small or even big truths and doctrines that we miss other centres of faith. All faith needs the balanced approach to Jesus - way, truth and life. Recall people who guided you well in your life. Pray for them.

Key themes of Divine Renovation: Theme 5—Giving Priority to the Sunday Masses - Fr Mallon pointed out that as a young priest he spent most of his time and energy on things that happened during the week such as funerals and house visits until he realized that the one time in the week when most of the people are gathered, the Sunday Liturgy, was receiving very little of his attention. He then decided to shift his attention to the Sunday Masses concentrating on the 3 H's: Hospitality, Hymns and Homily. This makes sense as the highlight of our week as a Catholic Christian Community is our celebration of Sunday Mass (be it the Vigil or Sunday Morning). It should therefore be receiving the lion's share of our time, talents, and resources.

Fr Mallon also points out that for someone exploring the Catholic Faith that Mass can seem quite foreign and daunting, whilst at the same time acknowledging that Sunday Mass is the main source of catechesis in the parish: the place where we all learn and grow in faith. He recommends (and his experience has shown) that the Alpha course is the ideal first step for someone exploring the Christian Faith. He also recommends it for every parishioner as it renews our faith and gives us the courage to invite others into this wonderful family we call Church.

Giving priority to our Sunday Liturgy is an ongoing process and for the remainder of the Easter Season (until Pentecost Sunday) we will be singing a familiar Communion Hymn so that we can process to receive Communion whilst singing, thus allowing silent thanksgiving once the last person has received Communion. We will also sing the Regina Caeli to conclude Mass. This is the traditional Easter hymn to Our Lady. Working to enhance our Liturgy is one of the main ways in which we give praise to God and show enquirers how seriously we take our faith. Thanks to the organists and choir members who support us in our joyful praise to God.

Another of Fr Mallon's interesting observations was that the Church used to operate out of a Believe, Behave, Belong process, whereby you had to first believe what the Church taught, and then behave accordingly before you could belong, however, he now says that people need to feel they belong, before they start to believe and behave in a Christian manner, thus stressing the priority of being a welcoming, hospitable community that helps people feel that they truly belonging. This is something that every parishioner can help create.

Sign Up Sunday is being extended to allow those who weren't at Mass last Sunday to hand in their forms...please place your completed form into the box provided...the information will them be collated and stored in a database...thanks to the small team in SSLF who are working with the Diocesan Team to make sure this is done in compliance with GDPH legislation. In the meanwhiles St Columba's and Ss Leonard and Fergus are organizing for representatives of the various ministries to be available after Sunday Masses to answer any questions regarding their ministry. This will take place over the next couple of weeks to allow the database to be established and for people to attend Fr Keith Herrera's talk on the Holy Spirit (and Alpha) in preparation for Pentecost.

My hope is that Fr Keith's talk will enhance the influence of the Holy Spirit in our parishes, and enliven our personal relationship with Jesus, so that we may ever more generously engage in the life of our parish, and are encouraged to take the Good News of Jesus to those outside the Church.
