Gift Aid donors are reminded that they need to ensure that they have paid sufficient tax to cover claims. Thanks to everyone who financially supports the parishes; and enables the Church to reach out to those in need.

Financial transparency: as well as the parish accounts having recently been audited (and summary accounts having been published in this Newsletter) it is incumbent upon the parish to account for every penny that comes in and goes out. This means that any money collected in our Churches (such as Special Collections) is required to go through the Parish Bank Account, before being issued. The only two exceptions (that are sanctioned by the Parish Priest) are the SVDP Collection and Collections made at the end of funerals. The SVDP is a separate charity who is audited annually, and have their own financial protocols; and the Funeral Directors have their own approved financial protocols. If any other organization wishes to collect in the church they must have the express permission of the Parish Priest, and abide by the protocols laid down by the Diocese which are informed by the Charity Regulator OSCR.

Fully Alive

I asked a woman once if Johnny was in the house. She pointed at a chair and said, 'if he was here he would be there.' He never moved far! Jesus - he is here and there. The risen lord has moved on, but he has not fully left us. His Spirit dwells in us.

The one who came to earth has now gone back to heaven, bringing with him all that is human. His body - the man of heaven and the God of earth - is now the church, and that's us.

Before we are of any denomination or group, we are Christ's. We are baptised into the church of Christ; we live out our faith in different denominations. Today is the feast of the whole church we begin in him and end in him, like the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, on the paschal candle. Our faith is also renewed through living with Jesus - we are partners in our mission. Our faith is also renewed in reading and praying the gospel each day.
