# **Divine Renovation + Building Restoration = Parish Renewal**

### St Mary's Restoration: Phase 1—Exterior (Stonework, Guttering, Roof) - Costing—£250,000

As you know we are in the process of applying for a £100K grant from Historic Environment Scotland for the exterior of the St Mary's. This is only 40% of the actual cost of the work. The other 60% has to be found from other Grant Awarding Bodies and Parish Fundraising. Please note this is only for the exterior of the church, and does not include interior work such as a new heating system or disabled toilet or restoration of the organ. Also, it does not include restoration and modernization of the hall; for this we are looking to apply for a National Lottery Grant, however, this will require a lot from us, the Restoration Steering Group and History Sub-Group are working hard on your behalf, however, we need you to be involved: if you have any skills that might help or any contacts that might help, please be in touch. If you are unable to volunteer please keep St Mary's Restoration Project in your prayers.

Thanks again to all those who have donated, especially the parishioner from another parish who donated another £500 this week on behalf of her husband.

St Mary's Restoration Steering Group is pleased to inform you that our grant application to **Fife Environmental Trust** has been successful. St. Mary's has been awarded £48,000 (£3,000 more than we asked for). Once the rest of the funding has been secured FET will release this money so that we can start the work. Our parishes sincere thanks to the FET for awarding us this grant. This is the first step on a long road, but it is a good step. Thanks be to God.

A significant aspect of St Mary's Restoration will be to create a greener environment around and within the church. If you have any experience and/or connections in the Environmental Field please come forward.

Members of the Restoration Steering Group met with Professor Graeme Morton (whose interests include: the history of catholic worship in the city, migrant settlement, and the role of philanthropic and charitable bodies) and Dr Rwayda Al-Hamd in an effort to engage Dundee University in our Restoration Project. Another meeting was held with Dr Andrew Minto (Lecturer in Civil Engineering, Abertay University) who was very enthusiastic about the project and providing advise re the restoration.

Thanks to all those working on behalf of the parish and the academics for responding to our approach.

**St Mary's** sincere thanks to all those Councilors who have responded to our appeal for support. Especially Lynne Short and Kevin Keenan both of whom have visited the parish over the last couple of weeks. Also, thanks to the academics in our local Universities and Colleges who have also expressed interest and support.

St Mary's Leadership Team: I have invited Marian Milne, Lynn Smith, Anne Hampton and Jim Murphie to meet with me each week in order that I can make good decisions. Given the Restoration Project and our Divine Renovation aspirations they are many decisions to be made. In consulting weekly with this small group of faithful people I hope to be able to make good decisions promptly and fairly. We are currently going through training, and refining the parish's vision statement: "A place where people experience God in a personal way, so that they become delighted disciples, joyously putting God first, and willing to invite others to explore the love of God for them through our parish community." Please hold these people in your prayers as they courageously accept a new role in the parish. We have agreed to an initial trial period of 3 months.

Last week we looked at a Divine Renovation video 'The Primacy of Evangelisation' and then considered how to engage those who signed up to volunteer in the parish. To this end Anne Hampton was tasked with convening a Fabric Team to help Allan Blyth carry out the compulsory parish maintenance work. Lynn Smith will contact all those who signed up to help with Children's Liturgy and Hospitality after Sunday Mass. Jim Murphie will work on getting a baptismal preparation course up and running, whilst Marian Milne will liaise with Emily Murphy in producing new rotas for welcomers, readers, and Eucharistic Ministers.
