SSL&F and St Columba’s Parish Councils met last week and had good productive meetings. Full minutes will be posted on the noticeboards in due course and several copies of the minutes will be left at the back of the Church for anyone who is interested. I would like to highlight several issues of interest:

- Information gleaned from Sign Up Sheets will be loaded onto a secure database hosted by the Online Parish Accounting System (OPAS). Members of the PC’s will meet with a member of the Diocesan Staff this week for training on database.
- Divine Renovation and Alpha—moving on to look at Alpha and setting up of groups: hospitality and flexibility key features of Alpha Course. In the first instance leaders need to be identified and trained, and then as many parishioners as possible to take course.
- In St Columba’s a comprehensive account of Finances and Fabric work carried out were provided.
- In SSL&F Finances were described as ‘robust’ whilst the insulation, and reflooring of the hall, were also discussed. The formation of a Fabric Team is coming along whilst Tri-parish training was requested of the Diocese.
- In both parishes a statistical analysis was provided by one of the parishioner who took it upon himself to survey the number of people going to Mass across Dundee by attending every Mass over a couple of weekends. His analysis provided stark figures re the total Mass going population of Dundee. In one of the meetings he commented that the total Mass going population could be accommodate in 5 parishes.
- The news of the appointment of Fr Alex as Parish Administrator of SS Leonard & Fergus, and St Columba’s, was met with applause in one of the meetings.

St Mary's Restoration

As you know we are in the process of applying for a £100K grant from Historic Environment Scotland for the exterior of the St Mary's. This is only 40% of the actual cost of the work. The other 60% has to be found from other Grant Awarding Bodies and Parish Fundraising. Please note this is only for the exterior of the church, and does not include interior work such as a new heating system or disabled toilet or restoration of the organ. Also, it does not include restoration and modernization of the hall; for this we are looking to apply for a National Lottery Grant, however, this will require a lot from us, the Restoration Steering Group and History Sub-Group are working hard on your behalf, however, we need you to be involved: if you have any skills that might help or any contacts that might help, please be in touch. If you are unable to volunteer please keep St Mary's Restoration Project in your prayers.
