St Mary's Sanctuary Re-ordering—All materials originated from the Altar upon which Pope Benedict celebrated the open air Mass in Bellahouston Park, Glasgow in September 2010. Altar designed by Niamh Quail, with the bow fronted decorative elements and bookrest taken from Ambo/Lectern, all other Carrara marble re-built from material coming from the mensa of the Altar on which the Pope celebrated mass. The bookrest on the lectern is the original lectern bookrest from the Pope's mass with the exception of 2 small engraved panels, all materials have now been used either within St Catherine's Labouré Church, Glasgow or Immaculate Conception, Dundee.

Dates for your Calendar:

St Mary's, Taizé Prayer, Thursday 13th July 2023 from 7-8pm. **All welcome**. For anyone unfamiliar with Taizé prayer: Since 1940, the Taizé Community in France has developed a way of praying through scripture and song, setting short biblical texts to music. These short choruses are repeated several times and lead us from praise and thanksgiving into deeper contemplation of the mystery of God's love and mercy. The candlelight in the Church reminds us of the light of Christ: even when the night is very dark, either in our own life or in the world, Christ's love is a fire that never goes out. Each prayer service includes this type of sung prayer at the start, as well as intercessory prayers at the end. There are also scripture readings and a short commentary on a biblical text. The whole prayer service takes place in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament - which is exposed throughout - and there is time for silent Adoration too. The voice of God is often heard only in a whisper, in a breath of silence. Remaining in silence in God's presence, open to the Holy Spirit, is already a prayer. The service concludes with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

SS Leonard & Fergus' Sanctuary & Gathering Space Reordering: Fr Alex, Fr Jim, John O'Meara and a couple of members of the Fabric Team/Parish Council met with the MD of Ormsby's Church Suppliers to discuss the reordering of SSLF's sanctuary. He will now produce a floor plan of the final format. It was agreed that a disabled toilet would replace the Confessional room as is, and that a new Confessional would be situation behind the altar. A foyer encapsulating the space at the back of the church would be created via a floor to roof screen of wood and insulated glass. Bruno Ormsby (the MD) revealed that the altar furnisher that was promised has been slow in being released by another diocese, however he and (John O'Meara suggested) Malcolm Veal (our Diocesan Chancellor) will approach said diocese. It was stressed that the alterations were required for the 2025 and the 50th Anniversary Celebrations.

St Columba's Six Month Review: Fr Jim, Fr Alex, and reps of the Parish Council met with Malcolm Veal (Chancellor of the Diocese) and John Smith (Vice Chancellor) for a six month review. This meeting is part of the process whereby St Columba's has been granted an 18 month window (starting January 2023) to show that it is a viable parish. The meeting heard how numbers attending St Columba's Sunday Mass were up slightly to approximately 50. It also heard that despite spending £10K on a new boiler that the finances were stable. An appeal from the Community Officer of Strathmartine for St Columba's to offer some of the services currently run from the library during its refurbishment in 12 months time was discussed. Fr Alex and PC members were asked to contact the Community Officer to discuss the length of cover required and other possibilities. The Council reached out to the Parish to see the possibility of temporarily providing some of the facilities needed for some Community services held at Kirkton Community Centre when the Centre is being renovated. The discussion is on-going.

Divine Renovation + Building Restoration = Parish Renewal

St Mary's Restoration: Phase 1—Exterior (Stonework, Guttering, Roof) - Costing—£250,000

As you know we are in the process of applying for a £100K grant from Historic Environment Scotland (HES) for the exterior of the St Mary's. **Update: The application to HES has been submitted for 30th June deadline. Please keep a favourable outcome in your prayers.** This is only 40% of the actual cost of the work. The other 60% has to be found from other Grant Awarding Bodies and Parish Fundraising. Please note this is only for the exterior of the church, and does not include interior work such as a new heating system or disabled toilet or restoration of the organ. Also, it does not include restoration and modernization of the hall; for this we are looking to apply for a National Lottery Grant, however, this will require a lot from us, the Restoration Steering Group and History Sub-Group are working hard on your behalf, however, we need you to be involved: if you have any skills that might help or any contacts that might help, please be in touch. If you are unable to volunteer please keep St Mary's Restoration Project in your prayers.

Thanks again to all those who have donated; £5540 has been banked since the articles in the Courier/Tele and our Just Giving page is sitting at £3000.

A significant aspect of St Mary's Restoration will be to create a greener environment around and within the church. If you have any experience and/or connections in the Environmental Field please come forward.

Pope Francis published an encyclical on the environment called **Laudato Si** (meaning "**Praise be to You**"): "Today, however, we have to realize that a true ecological approach *always* becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the *cry of the earth and the cry of the poor*". (Chapter 1:Paragraph 49)

St Mary's Heating System is being updated and made more efficient. Holy Mass needed to be celebrated in the hall last week as work got underway. Necessarily we're going to have to be flexible and patient as the restoration work commences. Also, there are no grants available for reworking a heating system so the costs for this will have to come from parish funds, thankfully due to your previous fundraising we have sufficient.

Harrisons & Harrisons (**Organ Builders**) spent an afternoon inspecting St Mary's Organ last week; we await their report. This will help determine whether the organ is worth restoring.

St Mary's Restoration History Sub Group meet with Prof Graeme Morton Friday 14th July at 10.30am.

St Mary's Leadership Team: We are currently going through training and refining the parish's vision statement: "A place where people experience God in a personal way, so that they become delighted disciples, joyously putting God first, and willing to invite others to

explore the love of God for them through our parish community."

This week we continued discussing how the parish could be structured so that the priest could delegate authority for different areas of parish life. To this end Anne Hampton was tasked with convening a Fabric Team to help Allan Blyth carry out the compulsory parish maintenance work. Lynn Smith will contact all those who signed up to help with Children's Liturgy and Hospitality after Sunday Mass; and will look into running Alpha in the Autumn. Jim Murphie will work on getting a baptismal preparation course up and running, whilst Marian Milne will liaise with Emily Murphy and Pauline Johnstone in producing new rotas for welcomers, readers, and Eucharistic Ministers.
