Leadership Team—At St Mary's Leadership Team meeting this week we discussed the importance of Silence before Mass to prepare ourselves to celebrate the Sacred Mystery. It was noted that 2 people talking could disturb many people trying to pray. Therefore, we decided to have a 5 minute silent period before Mass, whereby a bell will be rung 5 minutes before Mass and the Procession will form at the Sacristy as a visible sign that we have entered into our silent preparation time. Mass will then start at the usual time with another ring of the bell. This will start this Sunday Masses. Please do everything you can to preserve this silence. The ideal time to catch up with friends is after Mass, especially in the hall over a cup of tea and cake.



## The Rock of the Church

Does God want us to be happy? How could anyone answer "no"? How could anyone suppose God is good or loving if it is not true that he wants us to be happy?

And yet look at Christ's line in the <u>Gospel</u> reading. Deny yourself, Jesus tells his faithful followers; take up your cross and follow me.

# What will save us from the evil that infects us and leaves us so willing to afflict others?

Denying yourself seems the very opposite of going for happiness, and the cross is an instrument of torture. Why would God want these things for his people? Does God want us to be unhappy?

A man divorcing his unaccomplished, middle-aged, dowdy wife to marry a much younger, prettier, successful woman explained his decision to his devastated wife this way. "God wants me to be happy," he told her, "and I can't be happy with you. I will be happy with her."

#### **Heating System:**

New Heating System in St Mary's: the 3 old boilers have been replaced by 2 new more efficient boilers, and the engineers are in the process of replacing the pipework running down either side of the church with new Finn Pipes which function as radiators. Finally 2 ceiling fans will be installed to keep the heat in the body of the Church. This will enable the old boiler house and garage to be demolished to make room for a green space.

It seems never to have crossed the mind of this husband that God might have any care for his wife's happiness. The husband's full view of the matter could be put this way: "God wants me to be happy, but God doesn't care at all about you."

This little story, common in its selfishness, shows the sickness of the post-fall human condition, so apt to privilege its own power or pleasure over any greater goods. We can't be happy in this condition, when we are glad enough to crush others to get what we want. What is to be done with us? What will make us happy? What will save us from the evil that infects us and leaves us so willing to afflict others?

This is where Christ's line comes in. The route to the happiness God does want for us has to go through the cross of Christ. Christ is *The Way* for us, and the cross is where we meet him, for the road to our true happiness in love and holiness in him.

# The Faith of our Fathers (2)...more on the remarkable Roche family:

Edward Roche and Elizabeth Richards married in St. Mary's, Lochee on 7th January 1873, although they were both living in Lochee when they married, neither was Scottish by birth. Edward's birthplace is given as Ireland and Elizabeth's as Liverpool which strangely changes to Wales in the next census.

In the 1881 census the Roche family are found living at 29 High Street, Lochee. He is a Grocer and they have

four sons.



By 1891 two more brothers have arrived, Patrick and Aloysius. Edward's mother Mary (80) is also living with them. One record has the family eventually totalling 15, but as yet we have seen the records for six boys followed by 3 girls.

Both John and Joseph Roche turn up in the records as students of the Scots College in Valladolid. Joseph (almost 2 years younger) arrived in 1892, aged 17. John arrived the following year, just short of his 20th birthday, having studied at "Le Petit Séminaire de Notre Dame des Champs, Paris". It was rare to have two brothers in the College at the same time. Fittingly, they were ordained priests on the same day

(along with 5 others) in the College chapel in

Valladolid, 21st May 1899.

By 1901 the family had moved to Gowans Bank.

Canon John Roche passed away at the age of 66 in Fernbrae Nursing Home, Dundee on 6th June 1940 with his usual residence being given at St Peter and Paul's; whilst his brother Alphonsus is parish priest in St Joseph's, and will eventually be made a Monsignor and Vicar General. (A full history of the brothers appointments in Dunkeld Diocese and further afield will appear next week.)

Margaret (Maggie) Roche (also buried with her 4 priest brothers in Balgay cemetery) taught in Lawside Primary. Remembered as 'a bit severe'

she was very musical and played the organ in the Friary; she is still remembered by former members of the choir. She lived in Lawside Ave.
