

Leadership Team—At St Mary's Leadership Team meeting this week we discussed the importance of Silence before Mass to prepare ourselves to celebrate the Sacred Mystery. It was noted that 2 people talking could disturb many people trying to pray. Therefore, we decided to have a 5 minute silent period before Mass, whereby a bell will be rung 5 minutes before Mass and the Procession will form at the Sacristy as a visible sign that we have entered into our silent preparation time. Mass will then start at the usual time with another ring of the bell. This will start this Sunday Masses. Please do everything you can to preserve this silence. The ideal time to catch up with friends is after Mass, especially in the hall over a cup of tea and cake.



I was beginning to think I was obsessed about Evangelisation however it would appear that I'm in good company and in harmony with the mind of the Church:

Bishop Robert Barron, one of the best known Bishop's in the world commented on Wednesday's Gospel:

Friends, in today's Gospel, Jesus declares his mission: "I must proclaim the good news of the Kingdom of God, because for this purpose I have been sent." And he continues to pursue his mission among us in our efforts to do the work of evangelization.

Do we need evangelization? The statistics couldn't be clearer. Did you know that the fastest-growing category in polls of religious affiliation is "none"? And did you know that there are far more "nones" than Catholics in this country?

So, Catholics cannot avoid the demand of evangelization, proclaiming the faith. Vatican II couldn't be clearer on this score, seeing the Church itself as nothing but a vehicle for evangelization: it's not so much the case that the Church has a mission,

Heating System:

New Heating System in St Mary's: the 3 old boilers have been replaced by 2 new more efficient boilers, and the engineers are in the process of replacing the pipework running down either side of the church with new Finn Pipes which function as radiators. Finally 2 ceiling fans will be installed to keep the heat in the body of the Church. This will enable the old boiler house and garage to be demolished to make room for a green space.

but rather that a mission has the Church.

St. Paul VI and St. John Paul II made this idea central to their teaching. In fact, John Paul famously called for a New Evangelization. Bringing people to Christ is not one work among many; rather, it is the central work of the Church, that around which everything else that we do revolves.

Our Sunday Liturgy (a Greek word meaning 'the work of the people) is at the heart of what it means to be a Catholic. The Second Vatican Council referred to the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian Life, and encourages active participation of all the faithful. This means that we try our best to join in with the Mass through our responses, singing, and silence. At each Sunday Mass we should have two readers, a cantor for the psalm, and someone to read the Prayers of the Faithful. It is a great honour to read, sing, or serve at Mass. In addition bringing down the Offertory, or taking up the Collection, or Welcoming people at the door are all ways that we can more actively participate in the Liturgy. Please participate as actively as your talents and gifts allow.

The Faith of our Fathers (3)...more on the remarkable Roche family:

The youngest Roche brother to be ordained was Aloysius, and his story is arguably the most interesting...he was to serve the people of The Most Holy Redeemer parish in Billericay, Essex, for 48 years...

"Father, later Canon, Aloysius Roche, was probably Billericay's most famous resident of the 20th century. He was ordained into the Redemptorists in 1913...A generous and modest man, Father Roche would wear his cassock out before buying a new one.

Father Roche was very prolific, writing many books. His most popular was A Bedside Book of Saints, published in 1934. He was one of the first Catholic priests to become well known through radio broadcasts, and in the early 1950's he even appeared on television his most impressive broadcast being the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. He often used to broadcast the epilogue at the close of transmission.

Father Roche was also an animal lover and his house always had a number of cats; and at one time a family of hedgehogs. He was author of These Animals of Ours (1939).

In 1962 Father Roche was elevated to the rank of canon. According to his obituary in the Catholic Herald, he had turned the honour down many times previously. Canon Roche retired in 1966 and died in February 1968. The Canon Roche Social Centre is named after him."
