GLANCING THOUGHTS—VICTORY IS OURS

Here is what the Readings for this week claim. By his cross, Christ conquered sin; by his resurrection, he destroyed death. At Easter, we celebrate his victory with joy.

The Second Reading affirms that Christ's victory is ours. If we have faith that Jesus is the Christ, then we are begotten by God. If we are, then we conquer the world. And if we do, then we love God, we love the children of God, and we keep God's commandments obediently. In that condition, we are victorious with Christ.

But these lines in the Second Reading look like joy-destroyers, don't they? If we don't keep God's commandments, if we don't love God's children, we don't conquer the world. And if we don't conquer the world, then we aren't begotten of God. And in that case we don't really have faith. How do we have victory then?

And it gets worse.

In another place, the same Epistle says that anyone who says he doesn't have sin is a liar (I John 1:8). So it seems that there is a Catch-22 here. If you sin, you aren't victorious. You are a loser. But if you try claiming that you don't sin, you are guilty of lying, which is a sin; and so you aren't victorious in that case either.

It seems that whether you think you sin or think you don't sin, you lose. So what happened to our victory? Where is joy?

The solution is to notice what faith is. Faith is the belief that Jesus is the Christ, the one who—the one who what? Well, the one who conquers sin and death.

So here is the message from the Readings. For our part, we are saved from sin and death by believing that we are saved from sin and death—by Christ. There is no Catch-22. Even in our sinful state, where truth forces us to confess our disobedience and our failures in love, we are victorious—over the sin and death in ourselves—as long as we believe that Christ won the victory for us.

This faith is what God requires of us, and the Second Reading is right: this requirement isn't burdensome.

So here is our joy: As long as we believe that Christ won the victory for us, the victory of Christ is ours.

SCOTTISH BISHOP RESPONDS "When vulnerable people. **MARCH 28. 2024 PRESS RELEASE**

Bishop John Keenan said, "Liberal Democrat MSP, Liam McArthur, has today published to die; rather, it is to commit a damaging bill which attacks human dignity and introduces a dangerous idea that a citizen can lose their value and worth. them live.

"The Assisted Dying for Terminally Ill Adults (Scotland) Bill may refer to 'assisted dving', but this is a euphemistic term which doesn't accurately describe the reality. Assisted dying is already practised by our health professionals and organisations, in the form of palliative care. An accurate term for what the Bill seeks to legalise is assisted suicide. It is to provide a patient with a lethal cocktail of drugs to kill themselves.

TO THE ASSISTED DYING BILL including the elderly, poor and disabled, express concerns about being a burden, the appropriate response is not to suggest that they have a duty to meeting their needs and providing the care and compassion they need to help

"This Bill has been introduced in Holy Week, when Christians reflect on the suffering, death and Resurrection of Jesus, the man who is their Lord and God and showed us what it means to be truly human. Where Liam McArthur's Bill sees little point in human suffering and promotes the idea that a person's life can become so hopeless as to be no longer worthwhile, this week is a a law which will allow a doctor timely reminder that when we support each other in suffering it can lead to a truly dignified death and offer the best of hope and possibility for our world.

This week a new **History Sub Group** of St Mary's Restoration Committee met. This group has been formed as the parish is required to investigate, preserve, and present it's historical heritage as a qualification for certain grants.

The newly formed group is full of enthusiasm, local knowledge and expertise, however it is also open to new members who have similar interests and talents. To enable you to decided whether you'd be interested in joining hereafter follows a broad remit for the group:

- To produce (an updated/Modern) version of the 1. Historical Record of St Mary's (building upon the previous Anniversary Booklets and other archive material).
- 2. To create a historical novel about St Mary's to stimulate interest in the Restoration Project and the Parish in general.
- 3. To produce Historical Display boards highlighting interesting aspects of St Mary's Heritage.
- 4. To develop St Mary's website into a historical archive.
- 5. To create an Interactive Visitor's Leaflet.
- 6. To create a catalogue of historical material.
- 7. To investigate the historical link between the parish and the school.
- To record an oral history of the parish.

If you have any stories to tell about St Mary's or indeed are interested in joining the group please contact Mary or George Burton via the parish email address.

Please keep 5 minutes silence before the start of each Sunday Mass. The bell will ring 5 minutes before Mass to mark the start of silence. This creates a decompression chamber in which we acclimatise to the Sacred and come into God's presence.
