By now most of you will have heard the sad news about Fr Martin Chamber's (our Bishop Elect) being found dead on Wednesday Morning. It looks like he passed away peacefully in his sleep. In a statement at 1pm, on Wednesday 10th April 2024, our Diocesan Administrator, Canon Kevin Golden announced the sad news:

"It is with deep regret and sorrow that I have to inform you that our Bishop Elect, Martin Chambers, died in his sleep last evening. May he rest in peace and may his family and loved ones find consolation in the Risen Lord and the love of family and friends."

Mass was celebrated on Friday in St Andrew's Cathedral for the repose of Fr Martin's soul. A good number of priests as well as many people of the Diocese were able to attend whilst Martin's brother and family were also in attendance. The Funeral Details will be announced in due course.

Please keep Fr Martin's family and friends in your prayers.

Eternal rest grant unto his soul, 0 Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

### GLANCING THOUGHTS—WHAT ARE WE SUPPOSED TO DO?

Once, in perplexity, people asked Jesus, "What are we supposed to do?" (John 6:28). The Second Reading raises this question for us too.

The Second Reading says that if you don't keep God's commandments but say that you know the Lord, you are a liar.

Being a liar is bad enough. But the Second Reading also says that if you don't keep the Lord's commandments, you don't know the Lord.

That is the worst, isn't it? Especially because the test for whether or not you know the Lord is not whether you have fervent prayer or sweet religious experience. No, the test is just whether you keep the Lord's commandments. That is why you lie if you don't keep the Lord's commandments but still try to tell yourself and others that you know the Lord.

In another passage, this same Epistle (1 John 1:6-8) claims that if you say you have no sin, you are a liar, too.

And now we have a real puzzle, don't we? To avoid the sin of lying, you have to confess that you do sinful things. But then you are confessing that you aren't keeping the Lord's commandments, aren't you? And in that case, you are a liar, and you don't know the Lord.

Well, then, what are we supposed to do?

The answer is in what Jesus told the people when they asked him that very question. Jesus said, "Believe on the one whom God has sent."

Notice that this is a command.

And here is what it means. We can tell the truth: that we are sinful. But it doesn't follow that we don't keep God's commandments. If we believe that Jesus is the Savior, sent by God to save us from our sins, then, sinful as we are, we are in fact keeping the commandment the Lord gave the people when they asked him what they were supposed to do.

And if we keep his command, then it is also true that we know him. We know him as the Christ, sent by God to save us from our sins.

It can be true then that we are sinful and that we keep the commandment of the Lord, both, if we believe that he will save us from our sinfulness.

So this is what we are supposed to do: know him.

This week a new **History Sub Group** of St Mary's Restoration Committee met. This group has been formed as the parish is required to investigate, preserve, and present it's historical heritage as a qualification for certain grants.

The newly formed group is full of enthusiasm, local knowledge and expertise, however it is also open to new members who have similar interests and talents. To enable you to decided whether you'd be interested in joining hereafter follows a broad remit for the group:

- 1. To produce (an updated/Modern) version of the Historical Record of St Mary's (building upon the previous Anniversary Booklets and other archive material).
- 2. To create a historical novel about St Mary's to stimulate interest in the Restoration Project and the Parish in general.
- 3. To produce Historical Display boards highlighting interesting aspects of St Mary's Heritage.
- 4. To develop St Mary's website into a historical archive.
- 5. To create an Interactive Visitor's Leaflet.
- 6. To create a catalogue of historical material.
- 7. To investigate the historical link between the parish and the school.
- 8. To record an oral history of the parish.
