Conversation in the Spirit Session 3

Lectio Divina: 1 Corinthians 12: 4-13

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another mighty deeds; to another prophecy; to another discernment of spirits; to another varieties of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.

For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

Quote to be pondered:

A synodal spirituality flows from the action of the Holy Spirit and requires listening to the Word of God, contemplation, silence and conversion of heart... humility, patience and a willingness to forgive and be forgiven. No one can progress along the path of authentic spirituality alone; we need support, including formation and spiritual accompaniment (support), both as individuals and as a community.' #43 Final Document

Question:

As we journey together in communion towards a synodal spirituality what changes does it require and who might provide



accompaniment/support for us?

Some context for the question:

A diocese is the area over which a Bishop has pastoral care. Our Diocese of Dunkeld is one of eight diocese in Scotland and our Bishop is Andrew McKenzie.

Our Diocese covers as far north as Montrose over to Pitlochry to Callander to High Valleyfield to Alloa to Kinross to Newport and back to Dundee. It's main centres of population are Dundee and Perth.

Presently we have 43 Churches that celebrate Sunday Mass. These are served by 25 priests of which 14 are home grown Diocesan Priests of which 12 are over 50, and 7 over 70. The remaining 11 are Missionary priests from various Religious Orders and Diocese throughout the world. Thanks to all those who have taken part in the Conversations of the Spirit as requested by the Bishop in order for him to discern the way forward for the Diocese.

The Leadership Team will now compile a report based upon the feedback from the groups. This will then be submitted to the Bishop and the Diocesan Synod Group. We will await to hear the findings of this Diocesan process once they've had a chance to reflect and ponder the reports



ADORATION OF JESUS IN THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Dear Parishioners, for some time now we have had Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursdays, after Mass, until 11am. We would now like to extend this during Thursdays - every Thursday - concluding with Benediction at 4.30pm.

"What we need in every parish is to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament frequently in holy hours of prayer" **Mother Teresa**





It is really necessary for people to commit to a specific time each week. When people make a commitment to specific times, we ensure that a number of people will be present before the Blessed Sacrament every hour it is exposed. Your commitment also means that the Church will remain open on Thursdays, and it allows other people to pay a visit, if only for a limited period.

For Health, Safety and security reasons, we need to have a minimum of two people in the Church throughout the day, from the end of Mass to Benediction. There is a sign-up sheet in the Church porch, with the period from 11am to 4.30pm divided into time slots of 30 minutes. As you know, the usual period of Adoration is one hour so, if you wish to pray for the full hour, please sign up for two consecutive time slots. Please also include your contact details in the space provided.

Jesus is important enough to us in our life that we set aside at least one hour each week to be in His presence, and to keep Him company. "In everything you do, put God first, and He will direct you and crown your efforts with success". **Proverbs 3:6**

7th Sunday of Easter Reflection by Anne M. Osdieck

In this Gospel Jesus says, "I wish that where I am they also may be with me." What do you find most reassuring about Jesus' wish?

...Jesus says to his friends: "I send the promise of my Father upon you" (v. 49). He is talking about the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, he who will accompany them, guide them, support them in their mission, defend them in spiritual battles. We thus understand something important: Jesus is not abandoning the disciples. He ascends to Heaven, but he does not leave them alone. Rather, precisely by ascending towards the Father, he ensures the *effusion of the Holy Spirit*, *of his Spirit*.



On another occasion he had said: "It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Counsellor will not come to you"— that is, the Spirit — (In 16:7). ... Thus, ascending to Heaven, instead of remaining beside a few people with his body, Jesus becomes close to all with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit makes Jesus present in us, beyond the barriers of time and space, to make us his witnesses in the world.

Straight afterwards—it is the second action—Christ raises his hands and *blesses the apostles* (cf. v. 50). ... Jesus ascends to the Father to *intercede* on our behalf, to present our humanity to him. Thus, before the eyes of the Father, with the humanity of Jesus, there are and always will be our lives, our hopes, our wounds. So, as he makes his "exodus" to Heaven, Christ "makes way" for us. He goes to prepare a place for us and, from this time forth, he intercedes for us, so that we may always be accompanied and blessed by the Father. Pope Francis Angelus for Ascension May 29, 2022
