Notice—Parish Fire Drill

Thanks to all those who took part in the Fire Drill on Tuesday.

The Fire Drill Procedure for St Mary's is straightforward:

if there is a Fire at the front of the church I will shout 'Fire, Fire' at which time we all make an orderly exit through the Fire door in the Church Foyer.

This has now been fitted with 2 signs:

'DOORS SHOULD BE UNBOLTED DURING TIMES OF SERVICE' and 'PUSH BOTH BARS FIRMLY TO OPEN.'

If there is a fire at the back of the Church we all exit through the sacristy and the Church House Door. <u>The Assembly point</u> is in the Church Car Park in front of the back door to the Hall.

We will be appointing Fire Wardens in the near future.

Thanks also to John Bourke and Billy Biggins for updating the emergency lighting in the Church Hall.

ST ANTHONY OF PADUA - MEMORIAL, FRIDAY 13th JUNE 2025

We are very fortunate in St Mary's to have a relic of St Anthony of Padua that has been venerated in Dundee for many years; first in the Friary and then St Mary's. St Anthony's Day this year is on Friday 13th June and we will celebrate the Saint's life and works in a special way at the 10am Mass: St Anthony's statue will be placed on the sanctuary and flowers can be placed in his honour. There will be an additional opportunity to recite the Novena prayer and venerate his relic at the end of Mass.

Unfortunately, due to the dates of Ascension Thursday and Pentecost this year, our focus has had to be on preparing for Pentecost Sunday and it has not been possible to celebrate the nine days of St Anthony's Novena as we did last year. WHY WEEKLY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION? Here are some reasons from the Apostolate of Eucharistic Adoration (https://eucharisticadoration.ie/whatis-adoration)

- Jesus wants it. In his Farewell discourse, (the priestly prayer) Jesus said "I am the Bread of life"; "It is my Father's will that whoever sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and that I should raise that person up on the last day. (In 6:35,40)
- Again, in His appearance as the Sacred Heart to St Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus said "I have a burning thirst to be honoured in the Blessed Sacrament".
- It is a wonderful generous response to the invitation of Jesus, "Could you not watch one hour with Me"?
- Many people who are committed to weekly adoration experience many graces and blessings.
- Saints, Popes and others have constantly advocated Eucharistic Adoration
- Adoration flows from the Mass itself. "It intensifies all that takes place in the Mass itself "Pope Benedict XVI.
- "Of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the Sacraments themselves and the one dearest to God." St Alphonsus Ligouri.

Glancing Thoughts Pentecost Year C—The Outpouring of the Spirit

In the Old Testament, God promised that in the last days, in the days of the Messiah, he would pour out his spirit on all of his people. In Acts 2:14-18, the apostle Peter quotes this promise to explain what is happening when the apostles speak in tongues at Pentecost. This outpouring of the Spirit on Pentecost marks the beginning of the period promised so long ago.

But why would God want to mark this great new beginning, the fulfilment of the Messianic promise, the start of the Church, by having the apostles speak in all the myriad languages of the polyglot world of their time? There are so many other things the Spirit might have done! Later, filled with the Spirit, the apostles heal the lame, cure the sick, cast out demons. Why didn't God mark the beginning of the outpouring of his Spirit by something more glorious than the ability to communicate with others without a translator?

Here we should remember the story of the Tower of Babel, told early in Genesis, not so long after the Fall. The people building the Tower of Babel all spoke one language; but they used this power that the commonality of language gave them, for evil, building a tower that reached to heaven. God defeated them by the simple expedient of multiplying their languages and leaving them unable to understand each other.

Now, in the new age, Christ offers all people salvation from their sin, through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. In this age of the Spirit-filled church, all human beings are invited into communion with the Lord and with each other. Human beings can be trusted with unity when they are incorporated into the one body of the Lord.

And maybe that is why God marks the beginning of the reign of his Spirit in the Church by overturning the Babel of human language. Filled with the Holy Spirit, human beings can be given again what they lost at the Tower of Babel, not for storming heaven, but for proclaiming the kingdom of heaven on earth.
