Diocesan Mission Day

We are in October, the month the Church reflects and prays for the Missions. Once again we have a Diocesan Mission day on the Saturday before Mission Sunday. This year we gather on **Saturday 18th October at St Mary's Forebank for 9.30am to end at 3.30pm**.

More and more questions are being raised about mission and how we do mission. The challenges of our modern world and Church are forcing us to question how to live mission in different ways.

Probably we Scots felt we were a well-established Church sending out lots of missionaries all over the world. However, Scotland has also always been a country receiving missionaries. We have always relied on missionaries! However, we were probably not aware of it! Why? Because they were generally white, their native language was English and they did not have to travel far. What would we have done without the Irish priests who often became Scottish Diocesan priests?

Many still regard Polish, African, Indian, Asian priests as a "stop gap". Scotland has fewer priests than we are used to, so we need to appoint priests from somewhere to our parishes. The majority of these wonderful priests are from missionary orders or Dioceses with a missionary spirit. They are not here to fill up the gaps but to announce the Good News.

Europe, the UK, Scotland are now missionary territories. Perhaps this concept is a little strange to us but we will eventually have to take this on board.

In the past years we have had some wonderful speakers who have often questioned us and helped us. This year we are so pleased to have Duncan MacLaren, a long time ago director of SCIAF and ex-director of Caritas International. Duncan has a vast amount of knowledge of our missionary Church.

The day so far suggested: Theme **MISSION AND THE MODERN CATHOLIC IDENTITY.**


- 9.30 am Arrival and coffee

The Archbishop of Glasgow, Bill Nolan, has expressed his horror at the terrorist attack on a Manchester synagogue.


He said: "The attack on innocent people taking part in a religious event in broad daylight is an act of evil which should be condemned by all right-thinking people. The Jewish community was memorably defined by Saint John Paul II as 'our older brothers in the faith' and we feel a special closeness to them in this hour of sorrow and fear.

"My prayers, and those of the Catholic community are for those who have died, the bereaved, the injured, and those who feel anxious and afraid. Leaders of all faiths must unite in times like this to make it clear that killing and destruction in the name

of religion is abhorrent. Violence and inhumanity have no place in the tenets of the great world faiths."

Many of our parishioners wish to support our ethnic communities at this difficult time and Michael Marr (MSP) has agreed to meet with us concerning the climate of fear experienced by some in our ethnic communities, in St Mary's Church Hall on Monday 20th October at 6pm. We are responding to a parishioner who expressed concern about the rising levels of anxiety amongst the Sri Lankan community of which she is a member. Michael will help clarify the language surrounding the issue of immigration and will listen to the concerns of those within our community of communities, whilst setting out the position of the Scottish Government.





From the parishioner who expressed concern:

"Yes, not only Sri Lankans other immigrants who came legally and who work and pay tax and who live under UK law are under lot of pressure and tension. We feel after seeing things on television people seem to look at us differently. People never knows how much we pay as our university fees and how much we pay as national health charges. We need people to know that all immigrants are not refugees and we are respecting Scottish people's ideas and their value."

A Little is a Lot

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus says that if you have faith even as big as a mustard seed, you could command trees and they would obey you. A mustard seed is very small. But none of us can get trees to obey our commands. And so, from this, it is clear that the faith any of us has is not even a very small amount.

That's not the only disheartening thought in the Gospel Reading. It gets worse. No matter how much faith you have, as the Gospel Reading makes plain, you are still highly unsatisfactory. Jesus says that, however hard you work in the service of the Lord, at the end of the day, recognizing all your sins in the day, you should say to yourself, I am an unprofitable servant of the Lord's.

This isn't a good thought to have before going to bed, is it? And it does make it hard to get out of bed in the morning, too. Who wants to wake up with this thought: "Oh boy, another day for me to be my sinful self! At the end of this day, I will be inadequate, unsatisfactory, and unprofitable!"

You can see why the prophet in the First Reading would say to the Lord, "How long, O Lord!" The prophet thinks it is hard to wait for the Lord to do something about the sins of other people. But it can be hard to wait for the Lord to take care of our own sins too. How long indeed!

But the First Reading also says that the just will live by faith. Now real living is joyous, not depressive. And here's another thing to see. The First Reading doesn't mention *how much* faith you need in order to live. So, apparently, any amount is enough. Your faith doesn't have to be even mustard seed size. You will still live, really *live*, as long as you have any faith at all.

And so we can wait for the Lord to do something about our sins. It doesn't take even as much faith as a mustard seed for us to live. And if we live in the Lord, then we can also rejoice in the Lord, even if we are also still unprofitable servants.


And if it brings a life of joy in the Lord, then however little our faith is, it is a lot, isn't it? And that is itself a joyful thought.

Please keep 5 minutes silence before the start of each Sunday Mass. The bell will ring 5 minutes before Mass to mark the start of silence. This creates a decompression chamber in which we acclimatise to the Sacred and come into God's presence.
